

RESOLUTION 23-08

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MURRAY, NEBRASKA, TO PROVIDE FOR NOTICE OF THE INTENTION TO CONSTRUCT A MUNICIPAL BUILDING TO USE PRIMARILY AS A MAINTENANCE SHOP.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MURRAY, NEBRASKA, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees finds and determines that construction of a municipal building for use primarily as a maintenance shop is necessary and beneficial to the Village.

WHEREAS, the law allows the construction without approval by the voters in an election so long as notice of the proposed construction is published in a legal newspaper of general circulation in the village unless within thirty days after the publication of the notice a remonstrance petition against the construction is signed by registered voters of the village equal in number to fifteen percent of the registered voters of the village voting at the last regular municipal election held therein and is filed with the governing body of the village.

WHEREAS, if the date for filing the remonstrance petition falls upon a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the signatures shall be collected within the thirty-day period, but the filing shall be considered timely if filed or postmarked on or before the next business day.

WHEREAS, if a petition with the necessary number of qualified signatures is timely filed, the question shall be submitted to the voters of the village at a general municipal election or a special election duly called for that purpose.

WHEREAS, if the construction is not approved, the construction shall not occur within one year following the election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Murray, Nebraska, that the clerk cause a notice of proposed construction to be published in the Omaha World-Herald which is a legal newspaper of general circulation in the village

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the notice include a statement that unless within thirty days after the publication a remonstrance petition against the construction is signed by registered voters of the village equal in number to fifteen percent of the registered voters of the village voting at the last regular municipal election held therein and is filed with the governing body of the village, the building may be constructed.
